This year's field contains 38 teams from 23 schools. The 19 trials each round will be taking place in five UCLA locations: Anderson School of Management, the School of Law, Rolfe Hall and Kaplan Hall.



Campus Map (with Parking, Trial, and Food Locations)

The map below is of the north campus of UCLA where all of the tournament will be held. You can enter from Sunset Boulevard by turning on Westwood Plaza and park in Parking Lot 4. You can either purchase parking at the Kiosk in P4 or use the metered parking down the ramp to the left. YOU WILL GET AN EXPENSIVE TICKET IF YOU DON'T HAVE A VALID PERMIT or METERED PARKING!!!! Please note partial closures of P5 due to Anderson School construction of new building adjacent to P5.

The buildings where trials will be held are in the red circles below at Anderson, Haines, Rolfe, Kaplan Humanities and Law. For food options, every team will receive 10 \$ 4.00 coupons that they can use on Sunday, January 20th, at the Il Tramezzino Café located in the Anderson School Courtyard. It will be open for lunch from 11:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.. You can also get food or coffee at Kerckhoff Hall and Ackerman Union's Food Court in the center of campus. The \$4.00 coupons ARE NOT valid at the other eateries just Il Tramezzino. Il Tramezzino will be closed Saturday evening and on Monday MLK Day. We will have pizza and drinks for all participants on Monday, at the closing ceremonies.

Fun Stuff

Erin Engelmann put a lot of thought into this section, so I'll be upset if you don't try some of these places out while you're here!

1. Diddy Riese (Westwood Village near South End of UCLA Campus)

You should definitely check out Diddy Riese if you get the chance. They sell cookies, ice cream, and shaved ice on the cheap, and they're always delicious. You can also ask for day-old cookies that sell by the dozen for heavily discounted prices. I would recommend mint chocolate chip between two double chocolate chip cookies if you're getting an ice cream sandwich, or lime/orange/pineapple with a scoop of vanilla ice cream if you're getting the shaved ice. Don't be intimidated by the long lines; they move quickly, and they're absolutely worth it.

How to get there: the store's just south of campus, on Broxton Avenue. It's south of Le Conte and north of Weyburn.

2. Santa Monica Pier/Santa Monica Place/3RD Street Promenade

I lumped these all together because they're relatively close by each other. The pier has a carnival sort of feel to it; it has a bunch of games, food, arcades, and even a small roller coaster (nothing like a dilapidated RacheterWorld ride, don't worry). And of course, you've got the beach there. Santa Monica Place is a large shopping complex just two blocks from the beach; it's just your standard upscale mall. 3RD Street is a lane lined with stores, ranging from pretty expensive to you-pretty-much-pay-with-diamonds. Santa Monica is frequented by street performers, and some of them have really cool acts. *How to get there*: parking can be difficult to find. Structures 7 and 8 are adjacent to the Place, and the Pier also has its own parking lot. If you're far away enough from the beach, street parking is also available (but I wouldn't recommend it). Personally, I prefer taking the Big Blue Bus. Route 1 runs from the school (Charles E. Young) to a stop by the pier. You should definitely research parking or bus routes beforehand. I'd also recommend doing a quick Google search to see what you want to hit around the Pier/Place/Promenade area. If you get a chance to go out there, do it. It'll be worth your while.

3. Sawtelle Blvd.

Food, food! There are three places you should definitely check out. The first is SushiStop, where they have quality rolls starting \$2.50 each. There's also great boba at CoCo Fresh Tea and Juice. Then, there's Brian's Shaved Ice.

If you go to Brian's, make sure you get the dole whip. It's life-changing. All three of these places are really close to each other, and there are a lot of other fantastic eateries in the area.

How to get there: the section on Sawtelle I'm referring to is between Olympic and La Grange. You're probably going to have to drive, though walking might be an option if you're willing to trek for a while. You can find parking on Corinth or Purdue (just make sure to read the signs). There's also an underground parking lot near CoCo on Olympic.

4. LACMA Lights

Since a picture is worth a thousand words, here it is:



This is the greatest free photo-op place around. Trust me, you're going to have a blast creating perfect shots of each other here.

How to get there: the address is 5905 Wilshire Blvd. It's about six miles east of the campus. You can get there via bus; the 720 Metro Rapid, which has a stop on the southeast corner of Westwood and Wilshire, will take you there. Parking would be pretty tough, unless you find a spot on Wilshire.

5. Hammer Museum

I'm not a big art museum guy, but Hammer is huge in LA so I'm sort of obligated to list it. It's just \$10 for admission, and based on my Google search critics think that's a steal. Right now, there are three special exhibitions at the Hammer: Nathaniel Mellors's "Sophisticated Neanderthal Interview," Kelly Nipper's "Black Forest," and Tacita Dean's "JG." I would check out the Hammer website (hammer.ucla.edu) before going here.

How to get there: the Hammer's on the NE corner of Westwood and Wilshire.

6. Ask Us
